
IIT-K to nurture startup dreams with master class

The event is open to all, however, only IIT-K students and registered investors, students and professionals would be allowed to participate in various competitions organised at the event. "The initiative is chance for students to attract investors for their startup idea. If the idea is viable enough, professionals and students will get a go ahead from the mentors and experts. People from all walks of life including experts, investors, startup founders, students and faculty members of the institute will participate in the two-day event," said head of IIT-K's E-Cell Mihikaa Jain. She said that through its eight editions, organised across various cities in India--Bengaluru, Pune, New Delhi. Hyderabad and Kolkata-SMC has engaged more than 5,000 startup enthusiasts, over 500 startups and 100 plus venture capital firms. "The opportunity will create an ecosystem for startups to leverage the power of the alumni -the expertise, mentoring, funding, government and corporate connects - to support their journey," Jain added.

Various workshops based topics as diverse as blockchain, augmented reality, virtual reality, drones, mobility and artificial intelligence would be organised.
